The Tate Year 3 Project

The Tate Year 3 Project sees Turner Prize and Oscar-winning artist Steve McQueen create one of the world's most ambitious contemporary art projects.

This partnership between Tate, Artangel and A New Direction will invite every primary school in London to be part of a giant collective portrait. It will capture tens of thousands of Year 3 school children in a milestone year in their development and be an epic picture of the city's present and an intimation of its future. We are delighted that our pupil's will participate.

Educational Visits

At Handsworth, we pride ourselves on providing an engaging, high-quality creative curriculum. Over the course of an academic year, each Year Group is given the opportunity to attend educational visits to help contextualise and consolidate their learning.

We also invite a large number of professionals into school to support a wide variety of skills and learning. For these events to be able to take place, we will occasionally request voluntary contributions. The school never profits from the trips we run and we will ensure that we do not ask for more than £15 per child over the course of the year (this excludes the Year 6 Residential).

Healthy School, Healthy Children

Children in Early Years and KS1 are given fruit during the first break. Children in KS2 are encouraged to bring fruit in for playtime. This should be kept in your child's book bag, not their lunchbox. As we are committed to being a healthy school, we ask that your child's playtime snack is limited to fruit and not biscuits, chocolate or other high sugar snacks. We would like to remind parents that **Handsworth is a Nut-Free Zone**. Please ensure that packed lunches and snacks do not contain any nuts
