Goldfinch

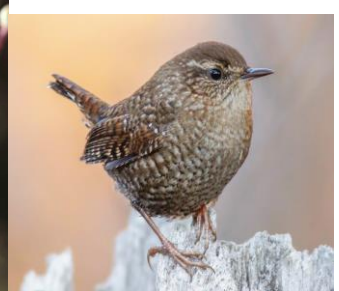


Starling

the jay, or the rare greenfinch, or the chaffinch, or the tiny wren



or the very rare nuthatch,



or the endangered songthrush.



If you hear nightingale at night (sometimes mixed up with the robin at night) then you will be very lucky as they are very rare too.
