





Mina mentions **Archaeopteryx** (pronounced ar-kee-op-te-riks) in chapter 26.

- Archaeopteryx is one of the *most important fossils* ever discovered.
- It is a bird from the **Upper Jurassic period**, about 150 million years ago.
- It shows the **evolutionary link** between theropod dinosaurs and birds.
- The first Archaeopteryx was **found in 1860** near Solnhofen in Bavaria, Germany.
- Today, **ten skeletons and one feather** of Archaeopteryx have been found.



Archaeopteryx




Archaeopteryx looked like a small carnivorous dinosaur with wings and feathers. It had a mouth with teeth, claws on the hands and a long tail.

When they are born, today's South American *hoatzin* have claws on their wings when they are young, just like Archaeopteryx.

At the beginning of chapter 28, Coot suggests calling his dad, a builder, to knock the garage down. Michael does not want this to happen.


Your task is to write a letter in role as Michael to his dad, persuading him not to knock down the garage.

LO: Persuasive writing



Example plan:

- Intro what is your argument? Be flattering to dad e.g. "I know you're a fair and logical man…"
- First paragraph it is a great place to store things. House might be cluttered otherwise.
- **Second paragraph** a good place for dad to have an 'office' or his own space.
- Third point when the baby gets older, they can play in there together.
- **Conclusion** briefly recap the main point.
