Parenthesis:

garden fork.



- A parenthesis is extra information added to a complete sentence.
- The original sentence makes sense without it.
- The extra information can be separated using commas, brackets or dashes.



Parenthesis (marked off with commas)

Commas are most commonly used to separate a parenthesis and don't draw much attention from the reader.

Parenthesis

Brackets are used to bring attention to parenthesis.

complete sentence

Flugtag is an event in which competitors attempt to fly home-made, human-powered flying machines.

Flugtag (German for flight day) is an event in which competitors attempt to fly home-made, humanpowered flying machines.

Parenthesis (marked off with brackets)

The writer might want to draw attention to important or funny extra information.

The winning team (piloting a giant chicken) celebrated their victory.
