Using Semi-colons



Semi-colons are used in formal writing.

Semi-colons can be used to link two independent clauses that are *closely related*.

I could not agree more. You were absolutely brilliant.


I could not agree more; you were absolutely brilliant.



You pulled off great footwork; it was spot on.

The jive isn't easy; the steps have to be clean.

The **semi-colon** emphasises the *close link*.



To link two clauses: replace the full stop with a semi-colon and then use a lower case letter to start the second main clause.

Using Semi-colons
