LO: Writing a newspaper report

Now you have the plan for your article, you will write it out.

- Remember to use you plan.
- Include a direct quote from an eye witness.
- Mix fact and opinion to balance the argument.
- ▶ The first paragraph has to GRAB the reader's attention.
 - Do not start with 'hello, and welcome to...'
 - Do not end with 'goodbye' or 'the end'
 - It is not an interview on television or a conversation between two people.
- Your success criteria is on the following slide.

Success Criteria for your news article

- Headline attracts attention and may include a pun.
- First paragraph answers the questions: Who? What? When? Where?
- Details such as names of people and places given in full.
- Information logically organised into paragraphs.
- Some opinions may be included, possibly disguised as facts.
- At least two interviews with participants / eye witnesses / experts / spokespeople.
- Direct and reported speech used correctly.
- Final paragraph brings the reader up to the present / future.
- A semi-colon used correctly.
