




Yesterday, we heard chapters 13-16.

In chapter 15, Mina quotes a famous poet called **William Blake**. The poem is **The Schoolboy**.


This is the first of many references to Blake in **Skellig**.

LO: William Blake



- William Blake was a **poet** and a **painter** who was born in London in 1757.
- He is an important figure of the Romantic age.
- **Romantic artists** were excited by emotions and tried to reflect the awe and wonder of the natural world.
- Blake once saw **angels** in a tree in a London park. He used to have lots of **visions** like that.
- Later in **Skellig**, David Almond shares another Blake poem called **The Angel**.
- He was a very **religious** man and he felt that the amazing things he saw in the world came from God.
