

Today we are looking at tenses:

Past Perfect

Paul had kicked the ball.

Eva had licked the lolly.

Present Perfect

Paul **has** kick**ed** the ball. I **have** lick**ed** the lolly. We use the past tense of the verb 'to have' (had) and the past tense of the main verb to show that the action was completed in the past before something else happened.

We use the present tense of the verb 'to have' (**have/has**) and the past tense of the main verb to show that the action started in the past and is continuous up until now.
