Just Step on the Scales, Please

Amanda Andrews is the Head Zoo Keeper at Fixelfield Zoo, where the staff are completing a particularly important task. Our reporter, Paul Cowan, went to talk to her.



Paul

It looks like your staff are rushed off their feet, Amanda. What's going on? Amanda It's time for the annual weigh-in here at the zoo. Around 10,000 animals have their height and weight recorded and logged on an international database. It's important for me and my team to find out if the animals are as healthy as they should be. We also need to know if any of them are pregnant, which is particularly crucial for our endangered species.

Paul

So how do you go about weighing them all?

Amanda We have a hugely diverse range of animals living here — from beetles to bears to big cats — so we have to use different scales for each of them. A feather-winged beetle, for example, can weigh around 0.4 milligrams (that's 0.4 thousandths of a gram), whilst our male Bactrian camel, Tony, weighs in at about 730 kg. Oh, and of course, most animals are not naturally cooperative.

Oh dear — that sounds ominous!

Amanda Yes, things can certainly get interesting! Bribery plays a big part in the weigh-in. Squirrel monkeys can't keep still, so keepers have to entice them with food to get them into the weighing pans. The emperor tamarins are trained to approach targets, which we place on the scales. Sometimes we have to get even more creative - we've built a set of scales that resemble a tree branch in the sloth enclosure, so they can lounge there and hang about as normal, completely unaware.


