Our Pupil Conferences last year were a great success. ## **Sports Update**

It has been an extremely busy term for sport at Handsworth. The classes have been using a new scheme of work - Real PE - which has been a great success, allowing exciting and new sporting opportunities across the school.

Our Young Sports Leaders have completed their training and have joined forces with the Sports Council to deliver lunchtime clubs in the small hall. These are aimed at Years 2 and 3, but anybody is welcome to join in during KS2 playtime on Mondays and Tuesdays.

It has once again been a tremendously successful term for competitions. We were fortunate enough to have representation at both the KS1 and KS2 Cross Country event. We have competed in Tag Rugby, Badminton, Sportshall Athletics and Table Tennis. The Year 6 Boys (Borough Champions) and Girls (Borough Second Place) have achieved great feats in the football competitions and we were crowned the inaugural Sitting Volleyball champions. Both the Boys Football Team and the Sitting Volleyball Team will represent Waltham Forest at The London School Games early in 2019.

#### **Attendance**

Our attendance to date is 97.2% with the national figure being 96%. We have had 372 late arrivals so far this year and 99 late collections.

Attendance and punctuality remain a priority for the school. Regular and punctual attendance is both a legal requirement and crucial to a child's success – there is a clear link between a high rate of attendance and high achievement. If pupils are not in lessons they cannot learn.

Please support us by ensuring your child is in school and ready to learn by 8.50am every day.

#### **Festive Attire**

It is always lovely to see the sprinkling of Christmas hats and tinsel headbands which start adorning children's heads during December! As is our tradition, the last day of term will be an optional Christmas Jumper/Hat Day.
