Use the Contact Us link via the website to let us know if you do not receive emails from school.







Our children had great fun at the Volleyball event today, well done to you all. You represented our school beautifully.



Each class has a mini-website to showcase class work, display homework, outline key areas of the curriculum specific to the year group, list class awards and update class diary items.



To follow your child's activities, click on the main menu tab, 'Classes', and choose your child's class.

We have been speaking to our children about the power of stepping away from drama, especially at school... Children are learning about power and social dynamics so of course they want to be part of what's going on. They tend to pick a side; there is a powerful sense of belonging in picking a side.

We need to teach the equal power of not getting involved. The power of the person who:

- Walks away
- Decides not to make a comment
- Counts to 5 before responding
- Distracts others from a moment of meanness
- Chooses to turn on their empathy
- Includes instead of excludes



Just imagine if children can see that power and show the courage to step away.
