Many Muslims will be celebrating Eid-ul-Adha which is also known as the 'Festival of Sacrifice. Eid-ul-Adha follows the end of the holy pilgrimage in Mecca and occurs on the twelfth month of the Islamic calendar. Muslims celebrate Eid-ul-Adha by sacrificing an animal such as a goat or a sheep which is then distributed into thirds. One third is shared with the poor and vulnerable (often in developing countries), the second third is shared with family and friends and the final third is kept for the home.

Eid celebrations include early morning prayers, a big feast, henna, traditional clothing and a special meal with family and friends.

The word Eid means 'feast' and Mubarak means 'blessed' so often you might hear wishes such as Eid Mubarak which means Blessed feast or you may just want to say Happy Eid. Eid Mubarak to all our families who will be celebrating next week.
