On the second page of this newsletter, you will find information about an app that you can download to give children an opportunity to practice their Maths Fluency.


As a school we have subscriptions with **Numbots** and **Times Tables Rockstars**.

Fluency in Maths

At Handsworth, we recognise that by building **fluency** in Maths, children can efficiently use foundational skills to solve deeper, more meaningful problems that they encounter in the world around them. **Fluency** contributes to success in the classroom and in everyday life.

For example, Maths **fluency** is useful for:

- * adding scores while playing a game
- * using mental maths to decide the best buy while shopping
- * estimating a percent when determining a tip for a delivery driver and so much more!

Throughout everyday life, **fluent** Maths thinkers use strategies and methods they understand to efficiently compute operations and check that their answers are reasonable.

What is Fluency in Maths?

Fluency in Maths is about developing number sense, knowing key mathematical facts, recalling them efficiently, rapidly, accurately and being able to apply a skill to multiple contexts. The National Curriculum states that children should become fluent in the fundamentals of Mathematics through varied and frequent practice. When children have a range of efficient strategies at their fingertips, they are comfortable in applying their knowledge in different situations. Building mathematical fluency gives them the skills and confidence necessary to succeed as mathematicians.

Your child is provided with many exciting opportunities to develop their fluency in their classrooms. As a school we have subscriptions with these fluency online resources: Numbots and Times Tables Rockstars. Please encourage your child to spend a few minutes daily to practise their number skills to develop their mathematical fluency. Please see your child's class teacher for their login details. 


Understanding Unicorn





















Our Reception children became journalists this week and provided news reports about the local bus incident.
