#### **Developing Friendship Skills**

School is the place where children learn to navigate the world of friendships. At this age, alliances often shift and change. Learning to make new friends and get along with peers can sometimes cause distress to some children.

#### How can parents help?


It is important to listen to your child's experiences with peer challenges. Instead of telling them what to do, help them problem-solve and clarify and understand their feelings. It is always best to avoid taking sides with either child-offer empathy for all of your child's feelings, and reflect on how their peer might be feeling. Coach your child to stand up for themselves using their words and help them learn to express their needs rather than attacking their friend. It is helpful to practice this together.
