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## OPEN CLASSROOMS

- No high heels, open-foed sandals or platform shoes. In the winter black ankle boots may be worn.
- Hair longer than chin-length must be tied up. Hair accessories must be reasonably sized and in school colours only. (Green, white, grey and black)



Our uniform is gender-neutral.

Gender-neutral is sometimes misunderstood to mean a ban of skirts or dresses - this isn't the case at all, It is about not prescribing what girls or boys wear and allowing free choice.

This enables children to choose the types of clothing they feel most comfortable in, and the most appropriate for how they want to dress.

A gender-neutral approach is based on eradicating gender stereotypes (ie, 'girls should wear this,' and 'boys should wear that') We are sure you are aware of the budget pressures schools are facing.
